INDUSTRY UPDATES

David Keeling Confirmed as OSHA Assistant Secretary of Labor for Occupational Safety and Health.



Placing him at the helm of OSHA during a pivotal time for our profession. Assistant Secretary Keeling is a long-time ASSP member with nearly 40 years of experience in occupational EHS. During his nomination hearing before the Senate Health, Education, Labor and Pensions (HELP) Committee on June 5, he underscored three priorities for OSHA moving forward:

- Modernizing standards and oversight by using technology, data and consensus standards to stay ahead of evolving workplace risks.
- Strengthening cooperation among safety professionals, employers and unions, including updates to OSHA's Voluntary Protection Programs.
- Transforming enforcement through proactive, predictive approaches that prevent injuries and fatalities before they happen


You'll receive an email with the complete ballot before the end of February to see if there will be some friendly competition for the positions. The names and qualifications of nominees will be communicated to the membership in the April Chapter newsletter.

How Is The Election Conducted?

The term of elected Chapter officers shall be from July 1 to June 30, as defined in Section V-4 of the Chapter ByLaws. Only Chapter members are allowed to vote. Election of officers for the ensuing year shall be held at the May meeting in attendance of a membership quorum in (ARTICLE IV, Section 8) as follows:

The Nominating and Election Committee shall serve as the Teller Committee for this vote. If there is only one candidate for office, the election may be by voice vote. If there is more than one candidate for any office, the election shall be by secret ballot (written or electronic). The candidate receiving the highest number of votes shall be declared elected. In the event of a tie vote, another secret ballot shall be held.



THERE'S A "SPY" AMONG US!!



No, no! Not a James Bond type, former KGB, or CIA agent, but a Safety Professional of the Year (SPY)! Yes, one of you in our chapter is a SPY, and the chapter wants to recognize you. But before the chapter can do that, you must be nominated by another member or self-nominated. A member who knows the professional and ASSP work you have accomplished over the past five years. In a large chapter of over 1,800 professionals, many of you meet the criteria, but fail to be recognized because you're not nominated.

This information is provided for those submitting their petition for the Edgar Monsanto Queeny Safety Professional of the Year at the society level. This same information should be used to formulate your petition, as well, for the chapter. The chapter SPY recipient is submitted to Region III for consideration for the Region III SPY against other Region III chapters' recipients.

Ideally the Region III SPY is then submitted to ASSP Society for consideration for the Edgar Monsanto Queeny Safety Professional of the Year against all other SPY petitioners. At any level, the SPY is a very prestigious and humbling recognition by your peers. Just to be nominated by someone is an honor. Many of you that are well deserving of this recognition may feel you don't make the grade, but let the chapter assure you, you do. Since 1982, the chapter has recognized 36 members for SPY.

Practice safe cooking this Thanksgiving.

Home cooking fires happen most often on Thanksgiving. Stand by your pan: if you are cooking at high temperatures, turn off the burner before leaving the kitchen.

Preventing Turkey Fryer Fires

When you fry foods, you increase the risk of a cooking fire. Keep in mind the potential dangers of deep frying a turkey:

- ✓ Use your turkey fryer only outdoors on a sturdy, level surface well away from things that can burn.
- ✓ Determine the correct amount of oil needed by first placing the turkey in the pot with water.
- ✓ Make sure your turkey is completely thawed before you fry it.
- ✓ Check the temperature often with a cooking thermometer so the oil won't overheat.
- ✓ Use long cooking gloves that protect hands and arms when you handle the pot, lid and handles of a turkey fryer.
